

WHY WE CHANGED OUR WEBSITE HOST

Our website has been powered by CrownWeb from the beginning. CrownWeb is affiliated with Temple Baptist Church, a Fundamental Baptist Church in Powell, Tenn. It is pastored by Clarence Sexton. Of course, we have no affiliation with Temple Baptist, we merely “hired” them to produce our website. However, in the light of recent events, which I will describe, we can no longer have any association with them lest it be assumed by some that we condone what is being promoted by Clarence Sexton and Temple Baptist.
